Research Assistant (Economics)

The Institute for Policy Integrity at New York University School of Law (www.policyintegrity.org, “Policy Integrity”) is seeking applications for a part-time research assistant position to support its economic research activities.

About Policy Integrity: Policy Integrity is a non-partisan think tank housed at New York University School of Law dedicated to improving the quality of government decisionmaking through legal advocacy and academic scholarship in the fields of administrative law and public policy. Policy Integrity’s interdisciplinary mission focuses on the rational use of economic analysis in government decisionmaking and how tools like cost-benefit analysis can improve policy design. Policy Integrity’s docket covers a range of issue areas, with an emphasis on federal- and state-level electricity policies and federal environmental protections.

Responsibilities: The research assistant will assist with issue-based reports and academic journal articles on a variety of topics within energy and environmental policy and electricity market design. Depending on the skills of the candidate and the needs of the team, tasks may include data gathering and processing, data analyses, conducting literature reviews, and researching issues around power sector and environmental regulation. Other duties may involve administration of a survey among various power sector actors.

Terms of Employment: The appointment is a part-time position for approximately 10 hours per week, with flexible working times, starting immediately.

Qualifications: The candidate must be detail-oriented and organized, with strong logical and analytical skills. Ability to communicate effectively is also required. Good command of R, Python, or other programming languages is highly desirable. Experience conducting statistical or econometric analyses, and/or a background in economics, statistics, or mathematics, is a plus. Interest in market regulation or electricity markets is a plus.
